## LIQUOR.

IMPORT DUTY—On distilled liquors, Eau de Cologne and Lavender water (other than drugs, etc., imported for *bona fide* medical purposes) Rs. 2 per gallon @ 50 degrees of the Gay-Lussac Alcoholometer at a temperature of 15 centigrade; the duty is augmented proportionally for each degree above 50 degrees and diminished proportionally for each degree below 50 degrees. *Vide* Section 6 of Liquor Ordinance of 1902.

The following are exempt from Duty—

- Trees, plants and seed intended for cultivation.
- Live stock for breeding purposes.
- Horses and Mules (Gazette of October 1st, 1908, page 525.)
- Tomb stones and ornaments for graves.
- Surgical and medical instruments imported by a doctor on arrival for his own use.
- Coal.
- Books, maps and printed matter.
- Gold bullion and gold coin.
- Coins admitted to circulation in the Protectorate.
- Agricultural implements.
- Materials for the construction and maintenance of railways, tramways and roads.

Dippers, Troughs, Shears, Clipping Machines, Castrators, Incubators and Poultry Appliances.
