This arose out of a telephonic enquiry by Mr. Faddy & H.O. as to whether we had any info about the activities of a firm called Bridlers at Dar es Salaam. I could not get anything at the time, but suggested that they should write, when further enquiry to be made.

I have now been through our various intelligence reports upon Port. E. A. and can find no mention of the firm in connection with the despatch of goods to German S. Africa.

It might be well to reply officially to this query and at the same time to inform you of the presence to obtain the P. & E. Prot. to Port. E. Africa, which is more or less common, of firms engaged in mining or mining as they are concerned with the shipping of the firms in Port. Prot.

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

With reference to your telephonic message yesterday evening, about the firm of Bridler and Company, Limited, Lourenco - Marques, I write to say that practically all we know about this firm is that it is receiving goods from most European countries, including Germany, a good proportion, I believe, from ^{and that they are making payments to Germany,} the latter country, What we are, however, interested to learn is whether there is any reason to suppose that the goods which are sent to Bridler find their way into German East Africa. As far as we are aware, the Company is formed under Portuguese law, and the managers are born Swiss.
