WITH reference to the correspondence ending with the letter from the India Office No. J. and P. 4397, dated the 27th November 1912, we have the honour to forward copy of a letter No. 159, dated the 7th January 1915, which we have received from the Government of Bombay on the subject of the further retention of the services of the clerk employed under the Protector of Emigrants at Karachi for work connected with the Uganda Railway.

2. We agree in the recommendation of the Local Government that the clerk should be retained for a further period of five years from the 1st April 1915, subject to the condition that he will be discharged if at any time within the period his services cease to be required. Sir,

Adverting to the correspondence ending with your memorandum No. 9359, dated the 18th December, 1912, I am directed to state that the period for which the further retention of the services of the clerk in the office of the Protector of Emigrants, Karachi, in connection with the emigration of Indians for work on the Uganda Railway was sanctioned by the Government of India expires on the 31st March, 1915. The recruitment of labourers and artisans for the Uganda Railway still continues and the number of men engaged by the Railway authorities through the agency of the Karachi Emigration Office during the last two years has been larger than in the preceding years and shows a tendency to increase still further in future.

2. In these circumstances the Governor in Council is of opinion that the present arrangement should remain in force for a further period of five years with effect from the 1st April, 1915, subject to the condition that the clerk will be discharged if at any time within that period his services cease to be required. I am accordingly to request that the Government of India may be moved to commend the proposal to the favourable consideration of the Home Government.
