*COPY TELEGRAM FROM VICEROY TO SECRETARY OF STATE,
DATED 9TH AUGUST 1915.*

*H. 6897. With reference to your telegram dated
1st July sanctioning passages by passenger steamer
for the wife of an Official, British East Africa
Protectorate, and two female nurses, we have since
ascertained that the Lady's condition was such that
the P. & O. S.S. Co. were justified in declining to
book the passages that the Lady's sister-in-law has
arranged to take her to Madras.*
