I am inclined to put in W.A.reg. 16
as a new E.A.Reg. 3 - i.e., to make it clear that an
officer is on probation until expressly confirmed, and,
incidentally, to put the onus on the officer if the
matter is overlooked. I would add to the second

"and, if the three years will expire during leave
of absence, at least one month before the date of his
application for permission to proceed on leave."

This regulation does not affect
the general right of the S. of S.
to terminate the employment
of any member of the Protectorate
service whenever he may see
fit to do so for the public
advantage.

Section 3. If at the end of three years from
the date of ^{first} arrival in the Protectorate
the officer's appointment is
confirmed on the recommendation
of the Governor approved by the
S. of S., but not otherwise,
he ceases to be on probation &
becomes eligible for pension
or gratuity or retirement in
accordance with the ~~last~~ regulations.

Application for such confirmation
should be made by the officer advised
to the Governor, through the Head of
his Department, at least three
months before the expiration of
the three years, and if the three

years will expire during leave of absence, at least one month before the date of his application for permission to proceed on leave.

2. I would invite your attention particularly to the alterations in paragraphs 2 & 3 which make clear the power of the Governor in respect of

terminating probationary appointments before the expiration of the period of probation, & also the procedure to be followed in respect of confirmation of an officer appointed on probation.

All paragraphs should be brought to the notice of all officers not serving in the Probation Department substituting the word "Commissioner" for the word "Minist".

I should explain that a case in ab. difficulty arose as to the termination of an officer before the completion of his period of probation has led me to revise these regulations, as I was advised that the Governor had not the

power to terminate 221 the appt. under the regulations in the form in wh. they then reside.

4. Other small alterations have been made, e.g. para. 8 now shows in general terms the leave granted to Sanatban Nicus, and para. 20 has been modified, as it related to "course of visit" in general, discussion for M.O's will be held at the Military Hospital, Rochester Row, in future.
