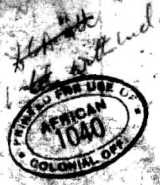

1915. Colonial Office has informed East Africa Protectorate that you require early amount of expenditure chargeable to common account certain classifications numbered one to nineteen. Should like to point out that classification allocations up to date have been based on mode of procedure in India as nothing else to be guided as follows, transport, mechanical transport, supplies, clothing, ordnance, veterinary and remounts, medical services, printing office and stationery, marine, railway posts and telegraphs, army signals, military works, passages, rents, secret services and intelligence department, prisoner of war. Can reclassify under the several heads asked for but would take time. Will not our heads do? Reply urgently required.

To General Tigue, Nairobi. (24th August, 1915)

19339. Your telegram 854/12. Your classification of common expenditure may be retained provided details enable provisions, forage, fuel, arms, ammunition and transport vehicles to be distinguished here. Expenditure on prisoners of war should be shown separately under the several heads.
