Patrol 20th Loyal North Lancashire Regiment

3rd October 1912, 11.30 am.

Patrol 20th Loyal North Lancashire Regiment under Captain Stokes, ambushed by 100 enemy 6 miles from Burn on 28th September. Shortly after another patrol 20th Loyal North Lancashire Regiment under Lieutenant Almond encountered the same enemy party whom they charged with the bayonet.

Both sides withdrew after a short fight, the enemy leaving 1 white and 3 Askaris dead. On our side both officers and 17 men were killed, 2 wounded, and 1 missing. We lost 15 rifles and captured 1.

No further information has been received as to the fight near Muktau reported in my telegram of 24th inst. No. 335. It is likely that the enemy patrol was practically annihilated and very few remained to be seen on 29th inst.
