1. 20th May, 1918 - 100 miles.

3d October, 1918, 11:00 a.m.

Patrol 20th Loyal North Lancashire Regiment under Captain Stokes, and flushed 3x 100 enemy 6 miles from Burn on 28th September. Shortly after another patrol 20th, Loyal North Lancashire Regiment under Lieutenant Almond encountered the same enemy party whom they charged with the bayonet.

Both sides withdrew after a short fight, the enemy leaving 1 white and 6 Askaris dead. On our side both officers and 11 men were killed - wounded, and 4 missing. We lost 15 rifles and captured 1.

On further information has been received, a small night near Muktau reported to my regiment of 24th Inf'ty No. 338, it being that the enemy patrol was practically annihilated and very few reached the front on 28th September.
