Referring to my telegrams of the 80th ult, lst inst. and 6th inst. Nos. 297, 303 and 304, the Bukehba operations under denoral Stewart were completely successful and the troops are now returning Kiemmu. Fort, wireless installation, Geverament buildings and boats were destroyed, while we took one Field Sun many rifles and valuable documents and destroyed two machine guns with our artillery fire. Our casualties about half (words apparently omitted) of whom Royal Fueiliers, Lieut Bachelor Rest African Rifles wounded. The enemy's casualties were greater.

The result of this operation, which was undertaken partly for meral effect of the decided success and partly in retaliation for the wanten raiding of native non-combatants by the enday, will have a most important political effect on the natives West of the lake. I will send a letter to the Officer Commanding German troops emphasising the fact that the action was in retaliation for his wanten raiding.

(2) I have lately sharted volunteer defence forces Nairebi (400) Hembessa (150) Emmiber (100). The recruiting for these forces will receive a great impotes from the Rubekha success.

These feroes will now receive ground for (one group indecipher rable) training and may efford useful assistance later when it will be pegsible to make a general advance.
