The Swedish Minister presents his compliments to His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the South African Union and should feel much obliged for an inquiry being made with regard to the facts mentioned in the enclosed translation of a letter from Mr. W. B. Beckman, Whinbo, Limited -

The Undersigned, who has passed an examination as Government Land Surveyor in the Union of South Africa /translating/, completed during the years 1913 and 1914, after having been appointed Land Surveyor in the British East Africa, two great surveying contracts for the Government of the Union.

According to the law there 50% of the survey fees are paid after finished work, 25% when the plans are examined and 25% when the result of the work has been controlled on the grounds.

On the first contract which was for about Rs 6000 - Re /1 Rupee - 1sh.4d./ have been paid 75% i.e. about Rs 4500. This contract was completed and the plans /i.e. maps etc./ were all delivered in September 1913, thus more than a year ago as this work has been fully controlled. Now to me reason why the remaining Rs 1500 should not be paid out. I may here mention that Mr. Dalhousie who has been appointed Deputy Director of Surveys /African Branch/, after the completion of my survey and after my having been paid 75% in agreement with him, offering Rs 8 a thousand feet instead of Rs. 12, which was quite against the law - and this he did only in June 1914, three after I had finished my next contract. I am, however, convinced that Captain Williams /about whom more here below/ will not approve of Mr. Dalhousie's way of acting.

The second survey contract was commenced 2nd June 1916, the total amount of this contract Rs. 16000. Out of this sum I received at the end of June 1916 about Rs. 1,000/- proceeding to the D.M. and D.M. for travelling expenses, as I was going back and had no means of money.

There is thus on this contract a balance of Rs. 6400/- and on the first contract Rs 1000/- together Rs. 7400/- or in English money a little more than £ 300. If these surveys were carried on at my own expense and the whole equipment as well as I lost during the survey & taken worth together Rs. 3300/- killed by sickness and by lions/ tigers, some also were bought cash by me and the food and pay for all natives was paid by myself during the time of the Survey. I therefore think it very unfair that I should have received only the amount necessary to cover my costs, and I cannot be satisfied having received any compensation for my work.

Three weeks ago having been advised by the Secretary of the British Legation at Simla that I wrote to the Government of British East Africa but has not even had reply to my letter. I also had one letter with Mr. Hartman who was asked to see there, I think on behalf of the British Legation application. It however doubtful whether he will be able to answer.

As I have written I am writing to the Secretary of the British Legation at Simla again and he advised me to submit you in the matter.

I enclose this letter. If anything might be done in this matter I should feel very much obliged to I do so great need of my money at present. A Captain Williams who was Director of Survey for British East Africa is acquainted with the above facts and I think that he who is a kind and straightforward person, willingly would help in the matter.
