SIR,

We have been asked by the Leipzig Missionary Society, through the Basel Missionary Society to forward to Mr. G.S. Hurbutt, Director of the Africa Inland Mission, British East Africa, the accompanying letter.

The Africa Inland Mission is an American Society with headquarters in Philadelphia. The accompanying letter states an offer of sale of property by the German Society to the American Society, and I am not quite clear whether it would be in accordance with the present British law regarding trading with the enemy that we should act in any way as an intermediary in the matter. If, however, your Department has no good reasons why the letter for Mr. Hurbutt should not be forwarded to him, we should be obliged if you would instruct that it be put into the post; but if its transmission is considered improper, kindly return it to us.

Dear Sir,

The unexpected events of last year, I am sorry to say, have delayed our plan of handing over our three Usamba mission-stations to the Africa Inland Mission and moreover through the removal of our Revd. J. Hofmann and his brethren have caused a temporary abandonment of this mission field. All the more grateful did I feel when I heard from Mr. J. H. Oldham that you had kindly taken care of our converts and stations. We also heard about it through the Board of the Africa Inland Mission in Philadelphia on April 23rd 15. The Board enquired on what conditions we were prepared to hand over our Usamba stations to the Africa Inland Mission. Our Board has consented to transfer the three stations Jutha, Muluang and Nymbani and all the buildings thereon to your Mission on payment of \$5000.

Any other objects however, belonging to our Society or being the private property of our missionaries, animals or inanimate such as furniture, animals etc., are not included in the above sum. Our missionaries having to leave so suddenly they were unable to

make a complete inventory. Will you be good enough to ask your missionaries to let you know whatever they found on their arrival. Should you wish to take these things over as well as estimate of their value could be made later on, our Senior Revd. J. Hofmann, if possible, being present. The ground does not belong to our Mission. It was rented from Government for 99 years. The deeds bearing on the lease of the respective sites date from the years 1898 (Jkutha), 1900 (Mulango) and 1910 (Nyumbani).-

I feel very grateful to you for having without delay attended to the spiritual needs of our native Christians and should be glad to get some more detailed information about their doings. The Lord grant wisdom and patience to the new pastors of these "children in Christ" to lead them on to the ways of truth and righteousness. May you reap with joy where our brethren have often sown with tears!
