EAST AFRICAN PROTECTION AREA.

In our capacity as Managing Agents in Britain until  
arrival of the new Africa Syndicate Ltd., and on instructions  
received from that Company, we have the honour to refer to the  
favour of your consideration the following question.

By the agreement signed on 25th. June, 1903, between  
the Crown Agents for the Colonies and the Syndicate, specifying  
the terms of the Syndicate's Commission were dated 1st.  
July, 1904, it was stipulated in Clause 3 that "sub-  
division and resurvey of the Depression Area into six blocks  
shall be forthwith proceeded with, and Clause 5 defines the  
starting date for the successive periods each of 2 years within  
one of which periods the Syndicate shall sell, or select for  
sale by Sub-Agents, portions of the subdivided areas."

The Syndicate now find it may be allowed a reasonable  
time, say, one year from the opening date defined in Clause 5,  
in which to carry out the subdivision and resurvey required by  
Clause 3.

The work will undoubtedly be done earlier, if it is at  
all possible to do so, but the present position is that the  
Syndicate's Surveyor Staff in East Africa have practically all  
joined Sir Harry's forces, and it is quite impossible to obtain

other suitable employees so long as the War lasts. The cost is  
estimated to carry on the work of the established series and the  
care of the large cattle and sheep herds of the Corporation AFBC,  
and this is more than enough to require the full time of such  
staff as are left or can be obtained. In particular it is now **385**  
impossible to obtain the services of skilled surveyors, and  
it is even understood that the East African Government is similarly  
circumstanced.
