

We have the honor to inform you arrangements have been entered into between the Messageries Maritimes Co and the British India Company under which passage tickets for First and Second class passengers are Interchangeable between Marseilles and Kilindini and Zanzibar and vice versa.

This arrangement has been made with a view of affording great facilities to the travelling Public to and from East Africa, and we trust it will be a benefit generally.

The regulations recently in force by the East African Governments have prevented the Civil Servants of those Governments from travelling by the British India Company's steamers homeward.

These we trust will now be removed so as to enable them to avail of the advantages which the arrangement entered into secures.

We shall be glad to know that the Colonial Office will give its support to this arrangement.




