

I have the honor to transmit to you, to your convenience, a copy of a letter from Mr. C. A. G. Colclough, relating to a proposal that forms shall be offered to contractors for early delivery of rolling stock for the London & North Eastern Railway, & to express whether you are of opinion that an arrangement of this kind should be adopted in the case of orders for the Uganda Railway.
