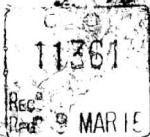

I have just received from a friend in Mombasa the information that eight (8) cases of household goods sent forward to that port by my wife at the time of her leaving South Africa to join me arrived at Mombasa per "Hollandia Castle" on the 2nd. January and that in spite of my friend's request that they should be forwarded to me here have been forwarded by the authorities to Nairobi and detained.

I may add that, prior to my repatriation I told Capt. Colridge (the Port Marshal) that these cases were exports and that he assured me that they would be forwarded on.

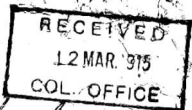
