Sir,

With reference to the case of

Mr. G. Home the facts are as follows:
 He has had two attacks of congestion &
 inflammation of the kidneys - not of a severe
 type & the present albuminuria is the result
 of these. The albuminuria is not in itself of
 much importance except as an indication of the
 previous kidney trouble. The point is that
 although he is now apparently well & strong
 he is liable to a recurrence of the kidney
 ailment & such attacks might be of a
 more severe type. He cannot be regarded
 as a first class life & after from some
 points of view a tropical climate is less
 injurious to him than the English climate,
 yet if he contracted malaria or dysentery
 the kidney trouble would be liable to
 recur & might be serious.
