## Attack on Serenli Station

Following arrangements have been made:-  
 (A) Immediate evacuation of Wogaria (B) 20 men of  
 police service batt. to proceed to mark road of Loran  
 (C) 10 armed constabulary from Wogaria to Moyale which  
 will not be evacuated - Joe will hold in readiness  
 300 Indian Soldiers for garrison of Kismayo if required.

No further details available - extent of trouble not known as yet.

Evidently the trouble is regarded  
 as of considerable if uncertain  
 extent. The main point is the  
 evacuation of Wogaria combined with  
 the retention of Moyale which can  
 only be readily reached through  
 Wogaria. But Loran commands  
 Wogaria to a certain extent and is  
 itself commanding access to through  
 Archers Post on the Gosa River.

Telegram from the Deputy of the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 1.39 p.m. 16th February 1916.)

My telegram of 7th February after consultation with General Officer Commanding, Graham Hope Barrett, and Executive Council following arrangements have been made Governor concurs (A) Immediate evacuation of Wajheir. (B) 200 men of police service battalion to proceed to Marti west of Lorian (C) 40 armed constabulary from Wajheir to Moyali which will not be evacuated. General Officer Commanding is prepared to hold in readiness 300 Indian soldiers for the garrison of Kisimayu if required. Re-occupation of Serenli would require larger forces than are available at present no further details available and the extent of trouble not known as yet.
