Following arrangements have been made:-  
(A) Immediate evacuation of Wapain (B) 200 men of  
Police Service Batt. to proceed to mark east of Lorian  
(C) 100 armed Constabulary from Wapain to Moyale which  
will not be evacuated. - 100 will hold in readiness  
300 Indian Soldiers for formation of Kismayo if required.  
No further details available - extent of trouble not known as yet.

Evidently the trouble is regarded  
as of considerable if uncertain  
extent. The main point is the  
evacuation of Wapain combined with  
the retention of Moyale which can  
only be readily reached through  
Wapain. But Lorian commands  
Wapain to a certain extent and is  
itself comparatively accessible through  
Archer's Port on the G.asso Regiro.

My telegram of 7th February after consultation with General Officer Commanding, Graham, Hope, Barrett and Executive Council following arrangements have been made Governor concurs (A) Immediate evacuation of Wajheir. (B) 200 men of police service battalion to proceed to Marti west of Lerian (C) 40 armed constabulary from Wajheir to Moyali which will not be evacuated. General Officer Commanding is prepared to hold in readiness 300 Indian soldiers for the garrison of Kismayu if required. Re-occupation of Serenli would require larger forces than are available at present no farther details available and the extent of trouble not known as yet.
