Sir,

I have the honour to bring to your notice the case of a V Grade Clerk in this administration, by name N.R.Jani.

2. He entered the Customs Department on 25th January 1897, and served till 1911. Early in the latter year he was reported by the Chief of Customs to be incapable of carrying out the duties of a Customs Officer at the Coast. In consideration of the length of his service it was decided to give him another chance and he was transferred to Homa Bay in the Nyanza Province where it was thought he might be able to do the work of a joint Customs and Administrative Clerk, the traffic being very small at that port.

Commissioner reported that Mr. Jant had recently met with a severe family bereavement which had affected his mind to such an extent that his services had become useless. He was granted 9 months' leave without pay, as from 23rd December, and went to India. This leave was extended on medical grounds and he returned to the Protectorate on 20th September last.

4. He was medically examined in Mombasa and pronounced fit for service but, though every endeavour has been made to obtain work for him in various Government Departments, as he is an elderly man who can neither speak, write, or understand English except to a very limited degree, and is unable to type, these efforts have been unsuccessful. He cannot return to his former post as traffic with Moma Bay no longer exists, nor does the Provincial Commissioner, Nyanza, desire to utilize his services elsewhere in the Province.

5. As it seems impossible to employ him usefully, after due consideration of his case in my Executive Council I have decided to suggest for your consideration that he be retired on the grounds of general inefficiency.
