The Board having assembled proceed to read the case history (attached) and to examine Lt. Jackson. The penile sere is nealed, but the bubo has started running again. The glands about the body are enlarged and hard. There is mottled eruption over the trunk, especially marked on the forearms. There is no sore throat. The rash has faded somewhat in the course of the last few days. He has been on mercury. We are of opinion that Lt. Jackson is suffering from secondary syphilis. He is unfit for active service.

"e recommend that he be discharged on that account.
