With reference to my despatch No.116 of the 16th instant, I have the honour to transmis herewith copies of reports by the Acting Provincial Commissioner, Jubaland, and Licotecant H. Rayne on the subject of the attack made by Aulihan Somali or rerenti, together with copies of two further memoranda summarizing the details available and the action taken by the covernment up to the present date.

He is further reported to have asked for permission to send a letter to the King in order to explain and justify his deportment. Further reports received yesterday state Auliban endeavouring to persuade Marchan and Mohamed Zubeir to join and that Abyssinian Aulihan will make attack on Marchan if they will not join. Power is convinced Abyssinian Aulihan responsible for present position. Further that belated letter arrived Kismayu on February 13th from Elliot stating Abyssinian Aulihan with assistance from Abyssinian troops threaten to make attack on Marchan and that if this occurs Marchan will join Abdurrahman Mursaal. Telegram No.56 of the 28th February

reported that Marchan are bolding general council to decide whether they shall join Aulihan and Power considers it quite likely that they will do so as men of Abdurrahman Mursaal have been sent to their country to travel through it as far as river Daun if Marehan permit them. Power also reported February 21st Mohamed Zuberr not to be trusted and feared attack on aremays unions troots were sent immediately. Mure with Arab Rifles left February 26th and shootd he thowe by now. Man-of-war left on same date for Kismayu. February 22nd Provincial Commissioner, Tunaland, reported native rumour that Llewellin, Assistant District Commissioner, Wajheir, was being held by Somali between Wajheir and Korokoro. Up to-date there is no confirmation of this report and no news from Wajheir so it may be presumed that nothing of great importance has taken place in that district. Further evidence has been received that the Abyssinians have given assistance to the Aulihan and Elliot was able to obtain passession of a letter signed by an Ahyssinian chief promising help to them. Believe that presence of troops and man-ofwar at Kismayu will have good effect on tribes

I have the honour to report that at 10 p.m. on the 3rd February Mr. Patermestre, Resident of Giumbo, Italian Samaliland, rade in from Ciumbo with a telegram from his Asting Governor which stated that a wire had been received from the Resident at Bardera that Serenlah had been attacked at 2 a.m. on the 3rd February by about one thousand Ogoden Auluhan Somalis and that the high askarie at Serenla who were scattered about the term were, with the exception of a few, killed and that as the District Commissioner had not been seen since he had probably met the same fate manually ends.

2. On the serming of the 3rd February a second telegrow was received from the inting Governor of Italian Semaliland in code to Mr. Patermestre informing him that the District Commissioner fol been killingant Serenli without five askaris and that the commission were under the orders of Abdul Rabson Mursal, Thief of the Aulilian, had taken away all summarities, the series askaris was ease and had sade prisoners of these askaris was understood the maxim. - I immediately wired to the Staff Officer at Gebwen to send a mounted camel newar to the Officer Commanding Troops, Southern Jubahand, and to tell him to bring in all recovered stock in his possession taken from the Wajheir section of Aukihan from the Samburu and return at once to Youti.
- 4. I also warsed the Staff Officer, Gobwen, and Captain Devoreux at Youti to take military precautions and instructed the Staff Officer to wood Mrs. Rayme and children into Kimmayu.

I have informed the Swedimb mission people that the mission ladies at Youti and Wefi should be sent to Kismayu.

- 8. I have taken these presentions as the Northern Aulihan might try and join the section from Wajheir who are at present in touch with Nr. Hayne. This however I consider extremely unlikely.
- 6. The action of the Ogaden Aulthan was entirely unprevened and consequently unferences. Mr. Elifet had full instructions to proceed very carefully in his dealings with the Marchan and Aulthan and on no account for do any act that would cause the tribes to take up arms against the Government.

Hr. Ellist wrote no quite recently that he was pleaned at the way things were progressing at Secondinal that he had just returned from a successful patrol amongst the Harehan who had received him well and was about to start his patrol through the Aulthen country.

7. I had warned Mr. Elliet against Abdul Raham Raham whom I know to be a clever and dangerous man and Mr. Elliet informed me that he was being closely watched.

- 8. During my visit to Serenli 1 interviewed Abdul Rahman Mursal and his only complaint was that he was not allowed to attack the Marchan. A few weeks age he again applied for permission to Mr. Elliot to take up arms against the Marchan or to be allowed to take his section to Northern Samaliland through Italian territory. Mr. Elliot informed him that he could not comment to the Marchan being attacked and that he must apply to the Italian Authorities to take his section through the Italian Protectorate.
- 9. I have just received a wire from the Benidest at Giumbo, who returned there yesterday, informing me that 65 askaris many wounded escaped from Serenii and are at present receiving assistance in Sardera. These well enough to travel will shortly come in to Kismays by the Italian side.
- 10. I have sent out instructions that all Chiefs of the Ogeden Mohamed Zubeir should come to see me in Kimmayu at once as it is very possible that Abdul Rahman Mursal may try to get them to join him. This naturally would make the situation sorious but I consider it unlikely.
- 11. I have written to the Resident of Giumbo requesting him if possible to have Mr. Elliot's remains taken acress and buried at Mardera.
- 12. I should like to point out that the Asting Government of Italian Somaliland has taken the Emphoral interest in this unfortunate affair.

He was in secretary communication with the Resident,
Bardera, and transmitted incodiately all news to Gimbs,
Also the trouble taken, and sympathy shown, by the
Resident

Resident of Giumbo and the action of the Resident of Bardera in his attention to all wounded ankaris.

18. It is with extreme regret that I have to report the death of an Officer of when I held the highest spinion and esteem, both efficially and personally and by his death the East Africa Protectorate has lost a most able and officient official.

#### Aulihan reid and attack on Serenii. Subject : -

Further to my reports of 12th instant I beg leave to forward the following information.

So far as I can gather I do not believe that the attack on Serenii or the murder of Mres Billiott was premeditated for any considerable time before it occured. Apparently some Semalis in Abyssinia have been threatening to raid the Marchan and it is possible that both Mr. Elliott and Haji Abdulrahman were aware of this. Same short time before Mr. Elliett's murder (I am not clear as to hew long, but am under the impression that it was only a few days before), the Aulthan in ar. Elliett's district raided the Marchan. The Provincial Commissioner Kismayu, states that his information on this raid is that 66 to 100 Aulihan, Rer Affie, Rer Afghab leeted 700 cmels and killed 9 men of Marchan (Rer Hassen). The P.C. thinks that Elliett get back this stock but is not clear.

I think we will lind later on that the whole of the trouble which led up to the leading of Serenli the night of the 2/3 instant was brought to a head by the raid mentioned sheve.

My information right up to date as regards the Mahamed Zubeir is most satisfactory. Their Suitan is ill

but proposes paying a visit to the P.C. in Kismayu to assure him of the Mahomed Zubeir's loyarty. He will be accompanied by the principal chiefs of his tribs. The only man of the Mahomed Suberr elders who was likely to have been in a position to give trouble is Maalim Abdi a late police afford. This man has considerable influence with the younger men of his tribe, and had some paitry grievance against the dovernment i went out of my way when I was on patrol to reconcile this man. He lollowed no the whole time and worked well, indeed I may say that he put his heart into the business and a great deal of what success I had was due to him. I mind it a great pity that these young rising men encul: not bemore closely watched and pains taken to englet their services on the side of the Government. Personally I think he is now quite reconciled and I am taking the great liberty of strongly recommending to the Provincial Commissioner of this province, that Mast Mast abould be found some small work. or given some small trust by the Government and kept well in touch with. No matter what his past record he is new a man to be reckened with, and is trusted and looked up to by the fighting men of the whole of his tribe. On the 12th instant I visited Gobwen and sismayu returning on the same day to my station here at Youte. During this visit I interviewed Mr. Paternostro, Resident Giumbo, Italian Semaliland. He informed that the remarks of the Serenli garrisen had left Barders an route Gium bo and that the Affendi had died of wounds. He could give no intermation as to the actual damage done to cuildings and walls at Serenli but stated that all escaped askaris had reached

Bardera without arms.

On arrival of these man hazar a while hald a court of inquiry into the whole matter and forward you the result. The Italians etate that the main body of the Aulinah are still four hours below Screenii on the River. He intermation as to the movements of the Aulinah had reached me on our side whatever.

My spies reurned last night 13-2-16 from the Deshek and reported all quiet. They reported rain in Dirrib in which district two sections of the Tur Adi are now camped. They stated further that they had heard the nex Sengaht econom of the Tur Adi intend bringing in their fine (mentioned in m) report to P.C. dated \$19-2-16 and copy to you) when remainder of looted stace.

As you wil: deubtless here noticed I neve refraint -ed from using the Italian wireless in reporting any of the late occurences here. I understand that the Provincial Commissioner, Kiemayu, reported the Serenti affeir and I am of the epinion that you will have received a copy of his wire. My reason for not wiring you is that wires may be preced up by the Germans and much made of this unfortunate and at present small Serenli affair.

During my recent patrol , found evidence implicating Herti traders indirectly, with the Aulihan raid on Samburu. Also evidence against certain Herti traders for trading in riflew and ammunitien | ean lay my nard on all these men, but the Provincial Commissioner, signeyu, has asked me to keep these matters pending in the meantime.

As you will readily understand in cases of this sort speed is everything and now that the scent has not immediately been fellowed up I expect the matter will fizzle out.

Hewever if you can convey to the efficer 1/c Reyale that

all herti and Isaac cerevans operating in his vicinity are worth watching, particularly on their return journeys southwards. I am sure there will be some interesting developments. As three cows can be fought at the merian for 100 rds, of Gras ammunition you will readily understand the great temptation to traders to do a little illegitimate trading. As regards rifles in Mahomed Zubeir country I cannot give any estimate as to numbers, but Maaling abdifrankly admits that they - the kahomed Zubeir - nave more rifles and more ammunition that any other tribe from Serenli southwards. On the recent patrol all young Mahomed Zubeir kept their rifles out of my sight, but did not worry to conceal them from destatch riders. These men reported plenty of rifles.

and bulk of the Mahomed Zureir tribe are at present (se far as concere my district) on the Wama at Afmadu and in Dirrib. In Dirrib there is a fair supply of wate, around balafa and near lires. Heavy showers failed during the past certainight in Dirrib.

information concerning him until next post.

- (8) I respectfully forward you the fellowing suggestions.

  (a) If one or more companies are sent here to re-injerce, that H. Coy.ce relieved at Youte and make a forced march on Italian side to re-occupy Serenii. It would be necessary to use the Italian side as the company would not be atrong enough to fight its way through on this side, but if bomad up at Serenii would be strong enough to give
- (b) That the whole matter be left just as it is, and the people here given an opportunity or showing their hand.

a good account of itself. If berenii were re-occupied successfully and held the whole situation would be saved.

(7) It is unnecessary for me to state that if (a) be put into operation that Officers who come with re-inforcements should have previous experience of this country.

As this will be last apportunity I will have for some time of forwarding you a report, I would like to state that my idea of attending the Manomed Zuberr meeting on Friday may seem feelhardy for an officer in my position. You can rely on me doing nothing feelish: the position is that I must get information and I am the only officer with any knowledge of the language. Mevertheless I will give up attending this meeting if in my epinion it is in the slightest risky.

At 10 p.m. on February 3rd the italian Los dent at Limbo rods in to Limmy with a talagram from the Acting Governor of Italian Samuliland which stated that a report had been received from the Italian Resident at Bardera to the offeet that Serenii had been attacked at 2 a.m. on February 3rd by about 1000 Aulihon Secalis, and that the Askaria at Beruali who were scattered about the town were, with some exemptions, killed, and that it was foured that Lieutonent Alliett bad shared the same fate as he had not been ween since. 65 askaris, many of whom were wounded, escaped to Berder On the morning of February 3rd a second talegree was received from the Acting Governor of Italian Samaliland addressed to the Italian Menident at Giumbe in confirmation of the first report, and stating that the inlines, who were in command of Abdulrehman Bursael, had departed after having gasked the town.

(N.A.- There seems to be some uncertainty as to whether the attack took place on February 2nd or February 3rd. Two telegroms were sent to the Chief Secretary by the Acting Provincial Commissioner, Ninnaya, on the action. 5. Estimate - Reports from Officers best qualified to judge show that they are not yet in a position to gauge the significance of the attack on Seronli. Almost all agree that Abdulrehman Sursual is a very shreed and calculating man who would be unlikely to countenance such an set without being fairly sure of his ground. There are three main theories (i) that German agents have been at work. This theory is chiefly supported by the fact that he has a son serving with the German East Africa Forces (ii) that Turkish agents have been at work through Sheikh Ali Nairobi, who lives fat Bardera (iii) that he has taken edvantage of our processmention clockhore to attempt to throw off British rule and make himself paramount in Jubaland.

Sheith Ali heirebi was formerly in the service of this Protostorate and was discussed by Mr. Aismorth in 1902. He then went to Heeca where he stayed for 3 or 4 years subsequently returning to Africa since when he has generally resided near Bardera. He is a Sheriff and has a large following in Italian Somaliland and Jubalande He is a great friend of Abdulressen Euranal and his tribe.

The Italian authorities at Berdera have been of the greatest assistance throughout and the greatest thunks of the Government have been conveyed to them.

- that since the outbreak of war enemy agents have been active in Abyssinia and their intrigues have occasioned several petty incidents on the matchiner. The Negus is inclined to friendship with those of the Mohammedan religion with whom he comes in contact and his visit to Semalifand in 1909 appears to have led him to believe that the Marchan and Ogeden Semali are practically unadministered, while the chief purveyors of Abyssinian rifles to the Semali would be particularly sensitive to bluff by Mchammedan enemy agents working under the Turkish Consul at Harrar.
  - (ii) This information is in some degree corroborated by (a) a telegram from the Provincial Commissioner, Lamu, dated February 22nd reporting that the Abdullah Somali state that last month four Abyssinians entered British territory and arranged for the revolt of the Aulihan, and (b) by a private letter from the late Lieutenant Elliot to Colonel Graham dated Serenii, January 18th, in which he says, "All well at present,

but trouble is looming large among the Auliban on both sides of the river. The Abyssinians have promised help to the Auliban and I have looted a letter signed and stamped by an Abyssinian object to that effect. This letter was probably lost at the time of the attack on Serenli.

and is stated to have had some party grudge against the Government. Lightenant Rayne has done all he can to recondile this man and reports that he has worked with him exceedingly well.

- (e) that the Mohamed Zubeir have more rifles and more ammunition than any tribe south of bereuli.
- (iv) in the second of these two reports, dated Yonte Pebruary 15th, he states that he has received reliable information that the Rehamed Zubeir will remain quiet if possible? The Sultan, Osman Seli Maghan, had arrived at Yonte and intended to hold a meeting of the Mohamed Zubeir chiefs at the Deshek Wama on Pebruary 18th. In the meahtime the young men were well in hand.
- (v) On the 21st the Officer Commanding Troops, Southern Jubaland, reported that the Italian authorities affirmed that the calprits in the raid on the Sosha villages, vide last week's precis, were the Tur Adi Section of the Auliban.

Men of Abdulrehman Bursal had been sent to the Marchan requesting permission to travel through their country as far as the Daus River on the Abyssimian border.
    - (ix) On the 24th two other telegrams were received from Mr.Power dated February 21st asking for the urgent despatch of treeps to Kismayu,

Kismayu, otherwise Kismayu might be attacked as the Mohamed Zubeir were not to be trusted.

Mr.Power was probably aware of the decision arrived at by the schamed Aubeir at the Council meeting to be held on the 19th, vide precis or Lieutenant Rayne's second report. It may be assumed that, as the tribe are not reported to be directly hostile, they have resolved to adopt a waiting attitude and to determine their future action by the trend of events.

(x) It is stated that Sheikh Ali, Nairobi has crossed into British territory. If this is so, he has probably come to attend the Marchan Council, and his presence there would not be advantageous to the Government.

## Disposition of Officers.


The Acting Provincial Commissioner, Kismayu, has been requested to employ Maalim Abgi in Government Service if possible (wide paragraph 1 (iii) above).

General. No news has been received from wajheir and it is hoped that the position there is satisfactory. The orders regarding the evacuation have probably not yet reached the station, but on the other hand sufficient time has now elapsed to enable the news of any rising in the district to arrive here.

Captain Mure with his force should reach Afmadu three or four days after his arrival in Kismayu, and his presence there, coupled with the appearance of the man-ef-war off Kismayu, will presently have a steadying effect.
