Sir,

I have the honour to report that the Officer-in-Charge of the Northern Frontier District has recently raised the question of the compensation to be awarded to members of the Northern Frontier District Armed Constabulary in respect of injuries which they may receive while on Government duty. The cases of two men are at present awaiting a ruling on the point, one of whom was shot in the shoulder by Abyssinian Tigre about 18 months ago and is medically certified to have sustained permanent partial injury, while the other died as the result of a wound received in December last.

2. Wound pensions and gratuities are granted

granted to members of the King's African Rifles and the Police, and I consider it would be inequitable to withhold a similar concession to members of the Armed Constabulary because they do not happen to be constituted under an Ordinance. It is unlikely that the expenditure will be large, while the knowledge that they are eligible for these awards will be keenly appreciated by the men. I have the honour therefore to recommend strongly that the question may receive your sympathetic consideration.

4. I should state that the Armed Constabulary in Jubaland, as well as those in the Northern Frontier District, are included in this recommendation.
