In continuation of my despatch No.147 of the 6th instant, I have the honour to transmit herewith a copy of a letter from Mr.S.F. Deck dated the 23rd ultimo, together with a copy of a further Memorandum sturnarising the events of the past week.

I take this opportunity of confirming the following telegram which T sent to you on the 6th instant:-

Telegram No. 60 of 6th March.

My telegram March 1st, 54. Report just received from Power dated February 29th indicates that the state of affairs in Jubaland is more satisfactory. I gather that it is unlikely that the Aulthan will receive assistance from other tribes. Am sending his reports by today's mail. Bowring."

Sir,

I have the nonour to infine you that I have returned here in accordance with your instructions with Captain Welseley Bourne and his Police. We arrived here February 21st, 1916.

- 2. I am sending camels with all ossible agreet to Wajneir to help Mr. plawellin and Mr. Turner to evacuate that Station as quickly as possible. Fifty five camels have already been sent and 50 more will be sent tomorrow or the day after. I am giec removing the transport rost from helka hobe on the horizon to Merti.
- 3. I have re eived information to-day that on February 19th the Adlihan on the Lorian had probably no knowledge of the capture of Serenleh, as they were still paying off the lalance of the fine levied on them. Between February 7th, the day we left the borian and February 19th, they brought in to helka Roba Post 303 head of cattle and 300 sheep, making the total paid up to 1200 head of cattle and 1775 sheep.
- I attach a statement of the information I obtained from them The attach a statement of the information I obtained from them The attach an their safari was probably the source of the report from Kismayu that a party of Aulinan had left the Serenich Pistrict to attach the Wajheir. They report that the Wajheir District is quiet and that the Monamed Tubeir

will resist the addings if the latter come to Wajneir from owneder. I think it sighly improbable that the Addings will attempt to come to Wajneir at present as until the between raids break there is a 5 days' waterless stratch, the two places.

- 5. I have instructed the Borsa, Sakuye and Aluran to move each from the district between Merti and the Larian to the istrict between Werti and the Uaso Nyiro rost, so that they will be notered by the Police garrison at Merti. The case Samburu and Rendili remaining Bast of the Uaso Nyiro rost in seein, noved further to the Wost where there is the grazing and water for them.
- 6. The conef difficulty lies in the position of the Foran, Sakuye and Ajuran at present using the wells of dayheir. These people cannot move till the rains break and must therefore to left to their fate. They are there in onsiderable numbers of present and may be able to look after themselves till the rains come when they can get away.
- 7. I do not enticipate any serious trouble from the fullihan on the Lorian who are too disunited and lacking in leaders to give must cause fer apprehension. The report from Lamu that this Aurinan are trying to stir up the Abed Wak and Abdalia is Tanaland probably gross from the fact that two men of the librail Section of Aulinan viz: Osman Bar and walim Hashi left the Lorian for the Tana immediately after the raid on the Samburu while as I have already reported the Abukr Adde sub-Section of the Turadda Aulinan, numbering possibly 150 people are also liming near the Tana and doubtiese making efforts to put themselves on good terms with the Abud Wak and Abdaliah.

8. I to not enticipate that 200 men will be required to deal with the situation thused by the evocuation of Wajneir, unless it is intended to take offensive measures against the other Ogaden in the Wajneir Fratrict. For defensive purposes 150 would be enough.

# PRECIS FOR WEEK ENDING SATURDAY MARCH 11th.

DENTIAL.

#### I. THE DETAILS.

(i) On March 7th a telegram was received from
Lichtenant Rayne addressed to the Officer Commanding
King's African Rifles stating that a large beraze was
held some days previously near PANGAL by the Mohamed
Zubeir, the Maghabal, the Bartist and the Anlihan but
that the result wis not yet known.

(ii) On the same day a telegram dated March 4th was
received from the asting Previously Commissioner,
which we will be the commissioner of the commended to attack the Aulihan the Mohamed Zubeir
would join the Aulihan when the rainy season

(N.B.- This was possibly despatched after the result of the baraza referred to in (1) had become known).

(iii) The Commander of H.M.S. "Thistle" which returned to Membasa on March 5th states that he was informed by the Italian Resident at Giumbe and by the Acting Provincial Commissioner, Kismayu, that it was reported by spies that the aulihan contemplate no further action at present unless the Herti are used egainst them.

(iv) On Merch 6th Mr. Power telegraphed that the Arab Bifles were an undisciplined mob and that the tribes were beginning to think that they were all the treeps evailable, that Abdurrahman Mursaal had obtained one led of repeas, begins merchandise, at Serebli and was addressering to gain address by bribes. The immediate demands of treeps would defeat

his plans, but delay would probably mean their success. He also said that the Sultan of the Mohamed Zubeir stated that the Tur Adi section of the southern Aulihan would join sheir marthern brothers.

(\*) Abdurrahman mursael is said to have spread reports to the effect that Nairobi and Mambasa are in the hands of the Germans and that Sritish supremacy was over.

(vi) On Fobruary 28rd Mr. Deck wrete eaying that steps were being taken to evacuate Wajheir, that on February 19th the Aulihan on the Lorian had probably no knowledge of the capture of Serenli as they were still paying off the fine imposed for the raid on the Samburu. He did not think it likely that the Aulihan would attempt to go to Wajheir until the rains broke, but had moved back the tribes in the district so that they might be covered by the garrison at Merti. The Aulihan near Wajheir are too disunited and lacking in leaders to give much cause for apprehension.

(vii) On February 24th Mr. Deak wrote saying that he anticipated no serious trouble from the Wajheir and Lorian Districts or from the Tana, and asked the Officer Commanding Police Service Companies to bring-unly 100 men to Merti for the present, leaving 186 at Archer's Post.

(viii) A safari of mules on the way to Wajheir from to Serenli was attacked by the Aulihan, most of the stock being taken and 10 of the party killed.

## IV. DECISIONS ARRIVED AT AND ACTION TAKEN

The telegrams referred to in I(iv) above were repeated to the General Staff Officer (1) who replied that it is impossible to spare any further trees for Jubaland at present.
