

In reply to your despatch of the 17th of January respecting Professor Simpson's recommendations in regard to disinfecting measures in connection with the Uganda railway at Kisumu, I have the honour to inform you that my Medical and Sanitary advisers could not at first accept Mr. Gourlay's views.

2. A meeting was held at the Principal Sanitation Officer's office on the Uganda railway in Kisumu on February 11th, 1916, between the Government

- a. That the Railway authorities erect four bogey bodies connected with pipes and supplied with valves as a disinfecting chamber close to the large goods shed.
- b. That a railway siding be constructed by the Railway to serve this chamber, in connection with the dead end now in existence.
- c. That all goods now stored on the station platform be placed on a stacking ground to be made in the rear of this chamber, so that in future all country produce be delivered there to expedite handling, and be treated there prior to despatch own country.

- a. That the Railway authorities erect two bogey bodies connected with pipes and supplied with valves at the dead end of the second line of sheds.
- b. That cargo from steamers, and local produce for despatch to Lake Ports be treated there.

Clayton Disinfectors.

- a. That the small Clayton Disinfectors be at the disposal of the Railway authorities, except when required by the Medical Officer.
