Sir,

With reference to paragraph 4 of my Confidential despatch No.42 of the 5th instant, in which I stated that the Director of Public Works put the increase in the Nairobi Electric Power and Lighting Company's business due to the war at 22%. I have the honour to inform you that on further and more exhaustive enquiry Mr. McGregor has estimates the additional load due exclusively to war conditions at 45 kilowatts over a normal load of 240 kilowatts the increase being therefore 19%.

As regards lamps, the number previous to war was 8,202; it is now 8,450 an increase of 3%. 24% of which military lamps numbering 1,957, account for just under 22%.
