Sir,

Somali encroachments Westwards.

I have the honour call your most urgent attention to that section of my report on the Garreh district in which I mention the presence of the Merrehan, Ror Hassan, at Geressa.

Last year, under pressure of a very dry season, they got permission from Mr. Bokh to go to Melka Wataha on the Dawa. They are now at Geressa and I understand that as soon as there is a sufficient amount of rain they had moved to Balisha - and are hoping on Friday next will show you what I mean about their numbers.

They are not, however, the only ones, it is true, but I should estimate no more than 1000 or 1200 people with no cattle, women and children.

But I do not know whether they are the only ones of a similar nature. There are others, I understand, but I would urge that the Geressa and Balisha Beran tribes, these and others, should be checked.

Four years ago when we came up the Dawa to the Beran via Wajheir, there were 1000 people at Wajheir and none at all at Melka Wataha on the Dawa. Now Wajheir is more than three-quarters Somali, and I

Aulihen are still crowding in. They are all along the Gase as far as Melka Galli on the north side and indeed as far as Mysore on the south side, and I have warned you last year they will be at the Gase Ryire Post in two years if not sooner. At present this encroachment of the Mysorehan

at the expense of our Bosnian and related
peoples by being forced more and more from their rightful
territory, and they are the only people who pay us
tribute, the Germans going scot free.

I don't if we can ever turn them out of Wajhier
