2. I would refer to your Confidential despatch of the 8th of June and the correspondence enclosed therein, in which it is argued that the incidence of pay and allowances of non-combatant units which have been raised in East Africa should not fall upon the Protectorate. I have not yet been notified of any decision in this matter but if the argument is maintained it appears to apply equally to the pensions in respect of these units.

3. Such pensions as these have in the past been debited to the Common Charges Account.
