With reference to my despatch No. 410 of the 5th ultimo reporting the retirement from the service of Mr. M. S. de Souza, Clerk in the Customs Department of this Protectorate, I have the honour to inform you that I am of opinion that the time has now come when the post of Head Godown Keeper at Mombasa recently held by Mr. de Souza should be filled by a European officer.

2. I consider that the post should be made distinct and shown as such in the Estimates for 1917 - 18, and that it should carry a scale of salary similar to that of the Inspector of Customs Watchmen and Boatmen, viz: £200 by £10 to £250 with free quarters or an allowance of £40 per annum in lieu. It should also carry a uniform allowance of £10 per annum similar to that provided for Preventive Officers, as the holder must wear uniform while performing his duties.

3. Mr. de Souza's salary was £240 per annum so that the increase in expenditure would in the first

first instance be only in respect of the £10 proposed as a uniform allowance.

4. For the post as reconstituted I recommend Mr. J. Sutherland, Preventive Officer at Mombasa, who proceeded on leave on the 18th instant after completing 39 months of resident service - vide my despatch No. 521 of 21st instant. Mr. Sutherland is reported by the Chief of Customs to have done good work during his tour of service and to be deserving of promotion. He was seconded from the home Customs for one tour of service only, and I should be glad therefore if arrangements could be made for his re-engagement.

5. I shall endeavour to fill locally the vacancy caused in the rank of Preventive Officers.
