341. Your telegram 12th September total requirements eleven telegraphists and three telephonists to replace (?) Fifth deceased Robson Booth reverted Bleakman married Pate invalided. Nine others marrying on expiration of present tours of service which terminate before end of January. Postmaster General desires to increase staff of telephonists by three and to decrease staff of telegraphists by same number.
