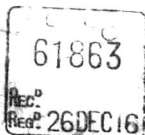

PRECIS FOR WEEK ENDING

Saturday, 16th September.

THE DETAILS.

(i) Mr. Llewellyn in a letter dated wajheir August 13th reports that as far as he can ascertain the Her Afgab Section of the Aulihan are still on the Bido Gatchi vide Precise August 5th I. (iii). He thinks that the Aulihan are now watering at Mil Wak and Abdurrahman Kuremal is still at Faf Hadam.

(ii) In a second letter dated August 24th Mr. Llewellyn reports that the Mohamed Abbeir have now demonstrated their loyalty to the Government. They have supplied all his wants in camels.

(iii) Mahr Sulimane scouts who had just returned from Burka Jabba, some 40 miles from the Juba River, stated to him that as far as that there are no Aulihan. They have apparently moved East and North-East, being nearest to Mil Wak just north of Kul Kulchival (Maraabit Map XII - D) and extending north as far as some 18 miles due west of Donli (Map XIII - B) where they are close to the marchon, Her Sulha. Mr. Llewellyn has heard that they intend to push up between the Marchon, Her Farah Ugas, and the river and would then cross into Abyssinian territory near Dole to the Aulihan under Fitaurari waganji Bela.

(iv) The Governor of Italian Somaliland, after consulting the Authorities at Rome, has replied to our telegram ( vide Precise, September End, IV) that passage through Italian territory will be granted to our troops, but that it is hoped that the move can be deferred for the present and that a larger force will be sent. The matter is under consideration. The Italian authorities appear to think that immediate action against the rebels is contemplated whereas all that is desired for the present is the re-occupation of Berauli.
