Sir,

With reference to Mr. Harcourt's despatch No. 670 of the 19th of August, 1915, I have the honour to inform you that 46 cases of Enteric fever were reported as having occurred among the European residents in this Protectorate during the year 1915. Seven of the cases proved fatal.

2. Of those affected, only two had undergone preventive inoculation, but 195 Europeans, including officials and non-officials, were inoculated during the year.

3. The approximate total number of Europeans in the Protectorate was 5,509.
