Sir,

I have the honour to report that, with the advice of my Executive Council, I have approved of the grant of £10 per mensem to Mr. J. W. H. Parkinson, Administrator General, as a remuneration for his duties as Custodian of Enemy Property, the amount to be paid out of fees collected on enemy property.

2. I propose that this allowance shall be made retrospective and continue to be made so long as Mr. Parkinson actually performs the duties of Custodian of Enemy Property in addition to those of his own office.

3. I have extended the concession to Mr. J. F. St. J. Prater, Deputy Registrar of the High Court, Mombasa, who performed the duties in

in question in addition to his own work during Mr. Parkinson's absence on leave.

4. In your despatch Zanzibar High Commission No. 17 of March 13th, 1916, you were pleased to intimate to me your approval of the payment of fees to the officers of the Zanzibar Government who have undertaken the work of liquidation at the rate of £1 a day. This rate of remuneration has been reduced to 10^s/- a day, or £15 a month, as from the month of May last. You will therefore no doubt agree that the rate recommended in the case of Messrs. Parkinson and Fawcett is not unreasonable.
