INCLOSURE TO DESCRIBE TO A 6664 OCT 20 11/6 PERCIS FOR FORTNIGHT ENDING

THE DETAILS.

- INCLOSURE
- (1) The Italian Resident at Bardera has telegraphed to the provincial Commissioner, Kismayu, that the Marchan are experiencing at difficulty in proventing the Aulihan from passing northwards. Sheriff Macao is at Gerba Hurre (Map XIII b) with 700 rifles and series and carneally begs that the Government will hasten.
- (11) On the 10th a letter dated Kismayu September 27th was received from Mr. Lane reporting:
- (a) that the Italian subjects of Bidi north of Mfudu have attacked the police post there. (N.B. Bidi is not shown on the map).
- (b) that at the beginning of September 30 Somali traders (Dolbahanta and Marchan) who are thought to have accompanied the Earehan Chief Farah Got on his return to Serenli through Italian territory were attacked by Aulihan at Galalio (Map XIII C), 27 being tilled. Farah Got is reported to have been among the slain;
- (c) that the Garrison at Alexandra has been strengthened by a detachment of the Arab Rifles;
- (d) that the Bartiri living with the Mohamed Zubeir near the Deshek Wama have been ordered to return to their own country near Salagli. This tribe did not join in the attack on Serenli but about the same time fell upon a mail party near Salagli killing one askari and to perfect.
- (III) It is understood that the deposition of hij Yasu, Emparor of Abyssinia, was unattended by disturbance.
- II. DISPOSITION OF OFFICERS. No change.
- III. Disposition of Someli Tribes. Mr. Lane reports that the Abd wak and Abdullah of the Lamu District have crossed into the Kismayu District and are with the Maghabul at Angle (Mombasa Map XII 0) and sh Bushleh, a watering place about 20 miles up the Birikau (Mombasa Map XII 1) eiver.
- IV. No Presis was issued last week. Wails to and from Jubaland are most irregular. Sd/- T. S. Thomas.
