Inquires whether they can be emp. in terms of Col. Reg. 27 that they no longer hold their respective appt., salary ceasing from date of notification. May free passages to England be given & the announcement of H.M. decision be published in Gazette?

Mr. Steel - Hartland

We have never assumed that the civil employment of these East Africa Protectorate officers, who were implicated in the East Africa Maxims mutiny, was ipso facto terminated by their discharge with ignominy from military service. The Governor allowed them to resume civil duties pending reference home. Our telegram of the 21st of November on 55020 below requested him to terminate their deployment forthwith. I think, therefore, that the procedure suggested in this telegram is the fairest and most convenient, that is, that the Governor should now tell the officers concerned that it is His Majesty's pleasure that they should no longer hold appointments in the Protectorate service, and that salary should cease as from the date of this notification. I would let them have ~~free~~ passages to England at any time within two months of the notification, but not thereafter. The decision should be published in the East Africa Protectorate Gazette.

One of the officers concerned, Mr R. Elliott
has in the meantime come home on leave. In his case
we have not used the formula about His Majesty's
pleasure, but have told him in a letter dated the
23rd of November that it has not been possible to
agree to his reinstatement in the Protectorate service
and that he therefore ceased to be entitled to pay
for any period after the date of our letter. I do
not think we need say anything more to him.

Since I dictated this a protest has
arrived from Mr Elliott raising questions
about his claims under his agreement
we shall have to go into his case,
or possibly eventually, into that of some
of the others. But whatever the result
it cannot be allowed to interfere with
the decision not to retain their services.
Sooner that decision is announced
usually the better.
