If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

- HEAD I OF PAPER.—In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be said whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 480).
- HEAD, 3.—State the description of Allowance for which the Applicants is recommended, viz. Superaumon, Compensation, Compensation
- Hear 5.—If the service has been interrupted by one or after breaks, the word "broken?", should be all before or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.
