PROCLAMATION.**Under the Customs Amendment Ordinance, 1915.**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the Customs Amendment Ordinance, 1915, I, Henry Conway-Belfield, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that the exportation of pepper be prohibited to all destinations other than the United Kingdom, British Possessions and Protectorates.

Meat Sellers Rs. 2-00 per month.
Dogs " 50 per year.

For each horse, mule, ox, cow, calf, camel, donkey for the first day Re. 1-00
For each succeeding day " 50
For each sheep, goat, pig per day " 12

RULES issued by His Excellency the Governor under the provisions of the Sales by Auction Ordinance, 1912, Section 18, (1), i.

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Sales by Auction Rules, 1912".

2. Every applicant for a licence under the Sales by Auction Ordinance, 1912, shall give security for the faithful discharge of his office in the following manner—

(a) Every applicant for a licence in Form A, shall give security in a bond for Rupees 1,00/- and shall find two sureties who shall each give security in a bond for a like sum.

Every applicant for a licence in Form B, shall give security in a bond for Rupees 150/- and shall find two sureties who shall each give security in a bond for a like sum.

3. These Rules have in accordance with the provisions of the Sales by Auction Ordinance, 1912, Section 18, (2), been previously published in the Official Gazette on the 3rd day of February, 1915, and have been submitted to and approved by the Legislative Council on the 25th day of January, 1916.

Exportation to the United States of America of Hides and Skins, other than Skins of Sheep and Goats bearing the wool or hair.

GOVERNOR'S licences to export to the United States of America hides and skins other than skins of sheep and goats bearing the wool or hair will be issued by the Chief of Customs on the following conditions:

- (1) The hides and skins must be consigned to one of His Majesty's Consuls General at the following four ports New York, Philadelphia, Boston or San Francisco "for account of" an approved importer.
- (2) The Bills of Lading must be through Bills of Lading and must be addressed to the Consul General for account of the approved importer.
- (3) Delivery will not be given by the Consul General until the importer has given him the prescribed guarantee.

NOTICE.**EUROPEAN WAR.**

The following telegrams have been received from the Secretary of State during the week:

January 24th.

Official News:—Hostile aeroplanes dropped bombs on Konyah East Coast on Sunday night but no Naval or Military damage was done; one civilian was killed and six were slightly injured. On Sunday noon two hostile seaplanes visited the same locality, but were driven off.

British headquarters report mining and artillery activity; elsewhere 24 French aeroplanes bombarded the Station and barracks at Metz; one aeroplane was lost. After mining and violent bombardment West of Arras-Lens Road the enemy penetrated several hundred yards of first line trench but our counter-attack drove them out, except in a 220 yards salient; the enemy lost heavily.

Caucasus: Precipitate Turkish retreat to Erzerum region continues; many prisoners, artillery and ammunition captured; Erzerum forts bombed.

General Ayhmer attacked the Turkish position six miles below Kut on 22nd; the fighting was fierce with varying success; very heavy casualties on both sides; since then bad weather and Tigris floods prevented further movements of troops.

General Townshend reports his supplies are sufficient, no further fighting.

January 25th.

Official News:—Head quarters in France reports successful bombardment of enemy trenches near Armentières causing considerable damage. A British patrol attacked a strongly held enemy trench, retiring without casualty. Elsewhere the enemy attempted to attack near the Mouth of the Yser but the French artillery prevented the enemy from leaving their trenches. Small enemy parties attempting to cross the Canal at Her Sart were repulsed.

Caucasus: Bombardment of Erzerum Forts continued; Kurdish detachments were defeated North of Lake Van.

Macedonia: French aeroplanes bombed cantonments of Monastir, and Ghevgheli.

A German seaplane was driven off from Dover by a British seaplane; a German seaplane was forced into the sea by a British machine gun to-night to-day.

January 26th.

Official News:—Head quarters in France report artillery activity on both sides; an enemy bomb store was exploded; aircraft is also active but British supremacy has been maintained. Elsewhere, after some explosions and violent bombardment, Germans attacked on mile front west of

Arras-Lens Road but were repulsed, except at two points where they occupied part of trench caused by the explosions.

Russians continue to press the Turks closely in Erzerum region.

Kut-el-Amara: Nothing further to report; recent fighting occurred on 23rd not seven miles from Kut.

January 27th.

Official News:—Head quarters in France report aerial activity; two enemy aeroplanes and two captive balloons were forced down; all our machines returned safely. Elsewhere the enemy was driven from the last Crater held west of the Arras-Lens Road. Near Neuville all Craters occupied by Germans have been re-captured and some prisoners taken. A zeppelin bombed villages in Epernay District.

Italy: Enemy attacked North-west Gorizia favoured by fog, Italians retired to second line trenches, where they repulsed successive enemy attacks with heavy loss.

Egypt: After fighting with Semensis on 23rd the enemy's camp was captured and burned; the enemy's force numbered 4,500 and his losses are 150 killed and 500 wounded; ours 28 killed and 270 wounded; 95 survivors from "Tara" in the hands of the Semensis are well treated.

Kut-el-Amara: Enemy evacuated trenches on land side and retired about one mile from our trenches.

January 28th.

Official News:—France: Nothing special.

Caucasus: Turkish attempts to assume offensive in Erzerum have been stopped.

Italy: Enemy offensive has been arrested; Italians firmly hold the occupied positions.

January 29th.

Official News:—Headquarters France report that an enemy infantry attack Northeast of Looe was repulsed under cover of heavy fire, mining and artillery activity at various points. Elsewhere hostile attacks repulsed west of Arras, enemy gained a footing in advanced trenches South of Givenchy.

French airship bombed Freiburg.

Caucasus: A large Turkish Column has been crushed west of Nulazert; Khryskala between Erzerum and Mush has been occupied.

Persia: A large Turkish force was defeated South of Lake Urumiah.
