in reply 1 am to state for the information of Mr. Secretary Bonar Law that the recommendation made by the Board in this matter was made in the interests of anipowners and shippers in order to avoid as far as possible the rick of detention by Board in Allied Warships.

The question whether fines a culd be imposed on ships which present inaccurate manifests at Mombasa is one mainly for the East African Government, but the board doubt the desirability of imposing heavy fines in such cases.
