Sir,

With reference to War Office letter of 18th October 1915, ~~relative to stores~~, relative to Stores &c required for the Forces in East Africa, I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that, in accordance with a request from this Department some of the stores &c detailed in the demand enclosed with the General Officer Commanding's letter of 8th September have been supplied by the Crown Agents for the Colonies, who, it is understood, desire to know to whom the cost is chargeable.

The Council have recently ascertained from the General Officer Commanding (see copy of telegrams enclosed) that all charges for the "common" administrative units, and all charges for other units, except pay and allowances, are being debited to the common charges account locally. The Council consider that similarly all stores, supplies &c sent from this country, whether by the War Office or the Crown Agents, for the purpose of the operations in East Africa should be treated as common charges, to be ultimately allocated on the same basis as the local common charges.
