Sir,

With reference to your letter 4143 of 1st February, enclosing a copy of correspondence with the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate on the subject of the status of the staff of the Uganda railway during the continuance of hostilities in East Africa, I am commanded by the Army Council to say that they would be glad to be informed whether it is proposed to put to the common charges account any pension or other charges of the railway staff. I am to observe that, although the General Officer Commanding has taken over the military control of the railway, the financial administration remains in the hands of the civil authorities, and the military authorities still pay for military transport on the railway as in the past (see copy of telegraphic correspondence enclosed). In this connection I am to invite attention to War Office letter 0165/7154 (F.1) of 28th December last relating to the provision of rolling stock and other railway material for the Uganda railway.

In the circumstances it is not clear to the Council that it would be proper to put to the common charges account the cost of any additional staff required.


