



His Majesty's Government have received conclusive evidence of widespread efforts on the part of the German Government to suppress the Mohammedan religion throughout their African Colonies.

On 17th April 1916, the following was received from the German Government:

ALL HALLIBURY
You are requested to inform the German Government from office of the fact that the following is the result of the investigation conducted by the German Government into the activities of the Mohammedan religion in the German Colonies.

This circular is signed by H. SCHNEIDER, the Special Governor of German East Africa and is dated some months before the outbreak of war. It was despatched to all Districts Commissioners in German East Africa.

The Secretary of the War Office makes the following announce-

ment:-

His Majesty's Government have received conclusive evidence of widespread efforts on the part of the German Government to suppress the Mohammedan religion throughout their African Colonies.

General Smuts has reported that in the German Government archives captured at Mochi the following circular was discovered.

" All Military Stations,

You are requested to send within three months from date of receipt a report stating what can be done by means of Government servants and Government teachers to effectively counteract the spread of Islamic propaganda. Do you consider it possible to make a regulation prohibiting Islam altogether. Possibly a rule might be enforced by which teachers would not be allowed to perform circumcisions or act as preachers in the Mosque, etc. The same prohibition might also be applied to other Government servants. The encouragement of pig breeding among natives is recommended by experts as an effective means of stopping the spread of Islam. Please consider the point also."

This circular is signed by Dr. Schnee the Imperial Governor of German East Africa and is dated some months before the outbreak of war. It was despatched to all District Commissioners in German East Africa.

(Sent 11.35 a.m. 1st May, 1916.)

1st May. Am sending by mail for distribution in Protectorate English and Arabic version of German documents regarding Islam recently captured by Smuts at Meschi. Consider that in meantime versions in vernacular languages should be made locally and published widely among those interested. Perhaps undesirable to publish in Arabic pending arrival of official version as existence of two versions may cause misunderstanding. Communicate this message and if necessary copies of document to Uganda, Zanzibar, Nyasaland, Somaliland. Zanzibar should supply Mafia.
