

**Grant of Africa General Service Medal—Operations in East Africa Protectorate, 1913-14.**

1. His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve of the Africa General Service Medal instituted under Army Order 59 of 1916, with clasp described "East Africa 1913-14", being granted to the forces employed in the military operations under the late Lieut. Colonel R. B. Graham, 3rd Bu. King's African Rifles, against the Murchan Tribe, East Africa Protectorate, between the 12th December, 1913, and the 21st May, 1914, both dates inclusive, provided that the claims of officers, soldiers and others are approved by the Army Council.

2. Officers, soldiers and others already in possession of the Africa General Service Medal instituted by His late Majesty King Edward VII. or who qualified for the award of the medal and clasp granted under Army Order 90 of 1916, will receive the clasp only.

3. The grant of the medal and clasp, or clasp only, to officers of the Regular and other forces, will be confined to those who had official sanction to be present.

4. Commanding officers will prepare on printed forms to be obtained at the War Office, nominal rolls in triplicate, of the individuals entitled to medals and clasps and forward them as soon as practicable to the Colonial Office for transmission to the War Office.

5. The names of officers and warrant officers will be entered in order of rank, and those of non-commissioned officers and men in alphabetical order.

6. The names of individuals who have forfeited the medal and clasp, or clasp only, under the conditions laid down in the Pay Warrant, are to be included in the rolls, their names being entered in red ink, and the nature of forfeiture stated in the column for remarks. The names of individuals who have become not effective by death, transfer to large, or out of sight are to similarly be recorded.
