MAGADI RAILWAY, BRITISH EAST AFRICA.

The Contractors who are completing the railway for the Magadi Soda Company inform us that, by order of the Government, all the Engines have been ithdrawn to Nais bi except one which may work to 28 miles.

Further, their Local Manager has informed our Manager in East Africa that they have received instructions from London to close down and send all the white staff home.

While, at a juncture like the present, we have not the least desire to press forward business interests when there are other matters of far greater importance to be dealt with by the Colonial Office, we venture to inquire whether there is any change in the position in the British East Africa Protectorate which would enable the Government once more to release the Entire and railway stock so that the work may be proceeded with on the Magadi Railway. In such a case we may be able to advise the Contractore, Messers. Pauling & Co., Ltd., to that effect, and thus avoid the withdrawal of their staff and the plouing down of their works, which cannot but have the result of causing a grave delay to the completion of the railway and the erection of the works, and may even possibly bring about the abandonment of the Company's enterprise in East Africa.

May we further ask whether it is possible to ascertain that notwithstanding the withdrawal of the Engines and Stock from the line, steps have been taken by the Government to safeguard the works of the Company at Magadi and their property on the railway from native or other depredations.
