In reply to your B.3497 of 20th instant, I have the honour to ferward Death Certificate of No.4081 Corporal T. Smith, E.A.S.C., who died at hwanza advanced Ease Hospital on 10/1/17 of Blackwater Fever.

- 2. At the onset of his last illness Corporal
 T. Smith was stationed at Ukerewe Island in charge of the
 Military Supply Depot. He contracted Blackwater Fever
 on the 5th January and a massage by cance was at once
 sent by Lieut. Logan, O. C. Ukerewe to Mwanza for further
 medical sidi on receipt of the massage on 8/1/17 we
 procured a steamer to take Capt. Marshall, Medical Officer
 to Ukerewe, Capt. Marshall decided to bring Cerporal
 Smith in forthe European Hespital, Mwanza, where the
 petient was admitted during the night of 6th January.
- 3. He was found to be suffering from a severe attack of Blackwater Pever with excessive jaundice.
 Every thing possible was resorted to to chek the disease and retain his strength, but the patient gradually succumbed to toxaemia and died on 10th January, 1917.
