The interim report by Commission of Enquiry appointed to enquire into financial, commercial and industrial policy of the Sultanate for the year 1916 was this report which last 12th July 1918.

Dr. Grindall

The Berlin and Brussels Act, and the Treaties which confer our freedom of action in the dominions of the Sultan of Zanzibar are under close scrutiny, with a view to modification or abrogation as part of the Peace Settlement. It suggests in its telegraph of the 21st of June or 3061, that the Commission of Enquiry should frame alternative acts of ratifications one on the assumption that there will be freedom of fiscal action, the other on the assumption that there will be no change. We can do no more at present. Put by.

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




— KEY PLAN —

**NAIROBI TOWNSHIP**



I regret that I am unable to make myself clearer and can only respectfully suggest that the map on the subject be referred to.

2. Personally I regard professor Simpson's recommendations on this matter as deserving of every respect and consideration. He is, I submit, much better qualified to express opinions on Town planning than anyone in this country. As the question is to be brought to the notice of the Secretary of State that Minister will, no doubt, obtain Professor Simpson's views on the proposal now put forward, and we will, in due course, have the benefit of the same for purposes of guidance.

Would you kindly explain how the proposal will break down the race barrier and dislocate the portion of Professor Simpson's scheme referred to.

2. Would the Neutral Zone, which now extends on both sides of the Swamp Road, be equally effective if it lay on one side of the road only provided that it is not reduced in area.

3. It will be necessary to give the arguments for and against the proposal very fully when addressing the Secretary of State and it would be therefore of great help if you would give as detailed reasons as possible.

That portion of the Neutral Zone which is the subject of this correspondence constitutes, in the position wherein it is placed by Professor Simpson, a race barrier as intended.

1. The proposal now put forward to change its position would appear to entail as results the dislocation of the related portion of Professor Simpson's scheme and the breaking down of the race barrier referred to above. Under these circumstances I regret I cannot approve of the suggested alteration.
2. I note that the Secretary of State is to be addressed on the subject. I return the plan as requested.

## Plot No. 165 Nairobi Road - Nairobi.

- I enclose a copy of a letter from the Land Officer with plan.
2. The proposal is to move the neutral zone to the west, its Eastern boundary being the Swamp road, thus enabling the whole area to the East of that road to be subdivided in accordance with one general scheme.
  3. Would you kindly comment on it. Professor Simpson's reasons for suggesting for the neutral zone to lie on both sides of the road are not apparent and, provided that the area of the zone is not materially reduced, the present suggestion seems preferable.
  4. Perhaps you would kindly communicate with the Land Officer direct if you require any further details before commenting. It will of course be necessary to address the Secretary of State before a decision can be given.
  5. Will you please return the plan.

point of view of Town Planning inasmuch as the area South of Ngara road between Swamp road and Racecourses road could be considered as a whole for purposes of subdivision. I desire therefore to recommend its adoption provided that Professor Simpson is prepared to agree.

Officer therefore, when forwarding the contemplated scheme of sub-division to the Municipal Committee for their consideration, suggested that it would be preferable to move the zone to the western side of Swamp Road, by which means the general sub-division of plots No. 163 to No. 140, i.e., those comprised within the area referred to above, would be outside the zone and could be dealt with as a whole.

3. The Municipal Committee expressed themselves in entire agreement with this suggestion and it was then referred to the Acting Principal Medical Officer.

I enclose copies of the correspondence which passed between the Secretariat and himself on the subject.

4. I regret that the reasons adduced by the Acting Principal Medical Officer in support of his opposition to the proposal are not clear to me. I am unaware of the reasons which led Professor Simpson to place the neutral zone on both sides of Swamp road but it does not appear that any detrimental effect would be caused if it were moved as now suggested to the western side of the road provided that the area is not reduced. I need hardly say that the proposal is not, as the Acting Principal Medical Officer appears to think, a reflection on the Professor's qualifications. It would undoubtedly be much more convenient from the point
