Sir,

In reply to your B.3407 of 20th instant, I have the honour to forward Death Certificate of No. 4001 Corporal T. Smith, E.A.S.C., who died at Mwanza Advanced Base Hospital on 10/1/17 of Blackwater Fever.

2. At the onset of his last illness Corporal T. Smith was stationed at Ukerewe Island in charge of the Military Supply Depot. He contracted Blackwater Fever on the 5th January and a message by canoe was at once sent by Lieut. Legan, O. O. Ukerewe to Mwanza for further medical aid. On receipt of the message on 6/1/17 we procured a steamer to take Capt. Marshall, Medical Officer to Ukerewe. Capt. Marshall decided to bring Corporal Smith in to the European Hospital, Mwanza, where the patient was admitted during the night of 6th January.

3. He was found to be suffering from a severe attack of Blackwater Fever with excessive jaundice. Every thing possible was resorted to to check the disease and retain his strength, but the patient gradually succumbed to toxæmia and died on 10th January, 1917.

4. I had previously known Corporal Smith in Kampala
