Sgt. Davies, E.A.S.C. was admitted 4-30 p.m., 3-3-17 in a collapsed condition, suffering from acute haemorrhagic malaria.

Previous history showed that he had suffered from frequent attacks of malaria during his eight years sojourn in E.E.A.

His present attack was as sudden as it was serious. He had latterly had ordinary attacks of ague.

In spite of all treatment and every endeavour made to overcome his critical condition, he never rallied.

He passed away quietly at 12-30 a.m. on the morning of 4. 3. 17.
