The cause for the dismissal of Mr. Bates is clear.

## Explanations of Anticipated Savings on Heads of Expenditure.

Head 1. Miscellaneous £400.

Absence of staff on leave or leave pay and minor economies.

Head 2d. Agricultural Department - Total  
£200,000.

The General Ordnance has not been brought into force.

Head 3d. Loan charges £5,000.

Due to transfer of interest and sinking fund charges on loans of £250,000 and £575,000 to Heads 21 and 29.

The explanations in all other cases are vacancies in the staff, stoppage of loan and the curtailment of departmental activity due to the sending of officers for Military service.

Head 32. Public Works Expenditure Rs. 700.

In sufficient provision for "Rents of Offices and Houses etc" and "Maintenance and Repair of Roads & Bridges" - A sum of Rs. 64,000 transferred to this Head from Head 33 "Loan Charges" in respect of Interest and sinking fund on Rs. 200,000 (loan of Rs. 200,000) Northern Water Supply, (C.O.O. No. 44 of 18th January 1917)

Head 33. Public Works Expenditure Rs. 1,000.

Expenditure on works sanctioned but not completed in 1915-16 accounts for the greater part of this amount, the remainder being that on Acquisition of land at Nossoba and New Roads & Bridges - Special.

Head 34. Protection of State of Bar Borgna  
Rs. 100,000.

It is anticipated that about Rs. 100,000 will be adjusted during 1916-17 out of Rs. 100,000 sanctioned in Colonial Office telegram of 7th September 1915.

Head 18a. Military Special Expenditure 58,081.

Or this 58,081 is for measures in  
connection with Somaliland unrest and the  
balance for works sanctioned but not  
completed in 1916-17. (C.O.D. No. 518  
of 30th August 1916 and No. 67 of 30th January  
1917 and Acting Governor's  
Despatch No. 222 of 30th August 1917)

Head 804. Post Office & Telegraphs - Special  
Expenditure 52,500.

Erection of Telegraph Line to Archer's  
Post, Mysore charges in connection  
with the contract for Mysore Wireless  
Station, and unexpended balances of  
1916-17 votes.

Head 81. Railway Department 587,187.

Or this 587,187 represents increased  
working expenses covered by Increased  
Revenue (Govtworks Despatch No. 579  
of 28th June 1916) and the balance  
(ay. 518) transferred to this Head from  
Head 85. Loan Charges in respect of  
interest and sinking fund on £420,000  
(loan of £250,000) and sinking fund on  
£375,000 loan. (C.O.D. No. 14 of 15th  
January 1917)

Head 81a. Railways Department - Special Expenditure 100.

Expenditure on works sanctioned but  
not completed in 1916-17. (C.O.D. No. 67  
of 30th January 1917)

Head 3. The Excellency the Governor General.

Increase in Government House furniture  
to bring it up to standard.

Increase in cost of paper and coast

time to Press staff proved inadequate.

Head 5. Provincial Administration Special  
Expenditure £300.

Expenditure in connection with the  
completion of New Kakanini (Urima) and  
Kachaliba (Turkana) Stations, the cost  
of which is set from revenue from Pines  
and Surplus Balances. (C.O.B. No. 2 of  
3rd January 1916 and 10.57 of 20th Jan 1917)

Head 6. Port & Marine Department £307.

Increased working of steam launch for  
hire, owing to diversion of traffic from  
Rizinini to Kobane, not from increased  
revenue. (C.O.B. No. 70 of 11th October  
1916).

Expenditure on works initiated but not  
completed in the previous year. (C.O.B.
