the contention that Lance Corp. Helton might not have
come to England if he had known that he could receive
only 3/4 a day while here, as it states that his reason
for asking to be sent to England was that the necessary
treatment was only available there. This should be
fully explained to him in our reply.

The difficulty of giving him full pay

(1/8 a day) need is shown in the minutes on 26799.

The O.C. states no reason for treating this as a special
case, as if it is so treated, it seems to me that all

the other cases in which the same mistake was made
must be similarly treated. In view of the circumstances

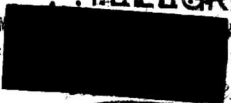
No.568. 30th August. Your despatch 24th May
Confidential last September Medical Board
recommended that Hilton should be invalided from
military service forthwith. He protested September
23rd and asked for revision with a view to sending
him to England for further treatment. Accordingly
he left by hired transport Briton December 19th.
Cannot ascertain any grounds for supposition
referred to in paragraph 2 your despatch as his rea-
son for asking to be sent to England was that
necessary treatment was only available there. At
the same time I am prepared to agree to full pay
during sick leave as a special case. Second class
passage granted no fare paid as he travelled by
military hired transport. Protectorate authorities
know nothing as to his travelling steerage.
