Sir,

With reference to the Governor's

despatch No.224 dated the 9th of March 1914,

I have the honour to inform you that there are
at present four vacancies in the permanent and
pensionable staff of Veterinary Officers. To
fill three of these vacancies the Acting Chief
Veterinary Officer recommends appointment to
this grade of Messrs.T.C.Bradshaw, A.W.Carter
and M.H.Heid

- 2. Mr.T.C.Bradshaw was appointed a
 Veterinary Officer on the non-pensionable
 establishment on November 6th 1914 and has not
 yet, therefore, completed the three-year
 probationary period. He has shown marked ability
 during his tour of service and is at present
 holding the post of Acting Assistant Veterinary
 Pathologist.
- 3. Mr.A.W.Carter was appointed on August 5th 1914, and Mr.M.H.Reid on October 3rd 1914.

These officers arrived in the Protectorate considerably handicapped through not having undergone post graduate training in tropical veterinary pathology and bacteriology. They have proved themselves capable district Veterinary Officers, and Mr.Kennedy recommends that they should both be placed on the permanent and pensionable staff, with the proviso that they should be required to take the necessary post graduate course in England at the first opportunity.

- 4. Before proceeding on leave, Lieutenant Colonel Stordy left no recommendations as to the filling of the appointments referred to, and it may be considered advisable to consult him in connection with the recommendations of Mr.Kennedy. I have nothing to add to the Acting Chief Veterinary Officer's remarks and submit the names of these three officers for appointment, with effect, in each case, from the termination of the three-year probationary period.
- 5. To fill the fourth vacancy, Mr.Kennedy has suggested Mr.F.J.S.Sheedy who was appointed a Neverthary officer in this Protectorate on the 1st of July 1914. Mr.Sheedy has been the late of July 1914. Mr.Sheedy has been practically the whole of his tour, and no opportunity has, therefore, been

afforded to judge of his ability as a district Veterinary Officer. Although he undoubtedly possesses the necessary professional ability, and has also a good knowledge of the East African netive, the Acting Chief Veterinary Officer is unable to decide whether this officer should be recommended for a post on the permanent and pensionable staff until he has been given an extended trial as a district Veterinary Officer. Mr. Sheedy has not yet undergone the necessary post graduate training. The military authorities have been asked if he can be allowed to revert to civil duty in this Protectorate and I will forward my recommendations regarding him at a later date.
