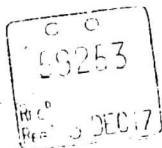

THE ENEMY PROPERTY ( DISPOSAL ) ORDINANCE, 1917.STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The above Ordinance has been enacted for the purpose of making provision for the sale of immoveable property belonging to enemy firms formerly trading in the Protectorate in pursuance of the instructions received from the Secretary of State in his Circular (2) of the 20th December, 1916.

2. The Ordinance is founded on the Nigerian Enemy Property (Disposal) Ordinance, 1916. A Comparative table is annexed.

3. I have advised that in view of the instructions of the Secretary of State assent could be given without prior reference to him.
